- These badges allow entrance to the Exhibit Hall only.
- Additional "Exhibit Hall Only" badges up to a maximum of Two (2) per company/Author will be available upon request at a rate of \$175.00 per badge.

Full Registration can be purchased for \$350.00 until June 2. After June 2, prices increase to \$400.00

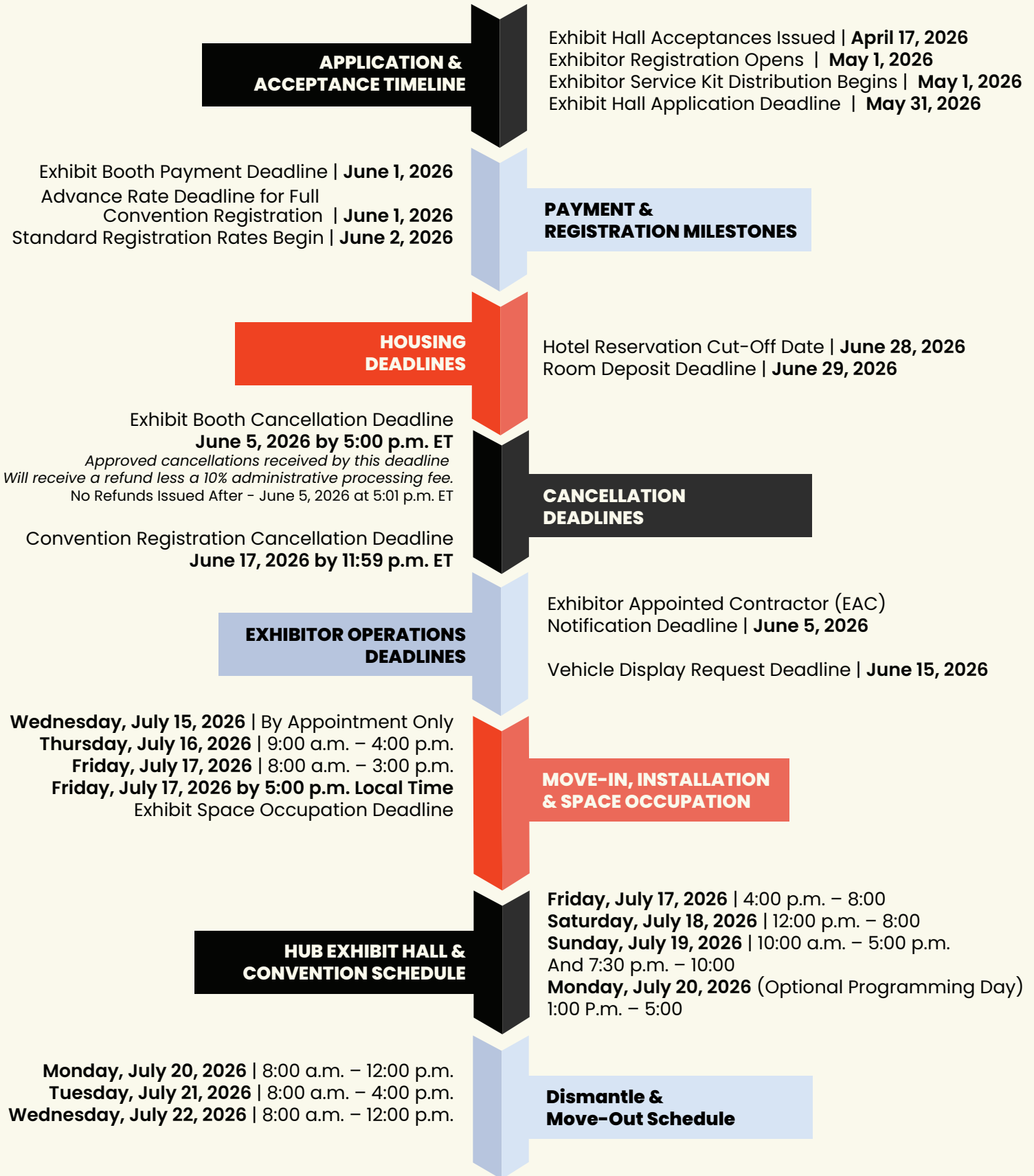
