ABORTION Ban or legal?	Legal. Gave approval to <u>Planned Parenthood</u> <u>abortion services in Louisville</u> . Vetoed <u>legislation</u> giving Attorney General Cameron the authority to regulate abortion providers during COVID. Sees <u>"born alive" abortion legislation</u> as preventing "something that never happens."	Ban. "Is <u>an advocate for the unborn</u> and continues to defend Kentucky's pro-life laws in court." Supports <u>current state law barring</u> <u>abortion</u> with no exceptions for rape or incest. <u>Supported</u> the U.S. Supreme Court overturning Roe v. Wade.
<b>CLIMATE</b> Should climate change be a top priority?	Mixed. <u>"I believe climate change is real</u> , I believe that it is causing more severe weather." His <u>2021</u> <u>energy plan</u> calls for increased investment in renewable and sustainable fuels and would "assess climate risk." However, fossil fuels are <u>"always going to be a part of our energy</u> <u>portfolio</u> , at least in the coming decades;" would "find ways that we can burn them more cleanly." Signed <u>a bill</u> requiring the state to divest from banks that are boycotting fossil fuel investments.	No. As Attorney General <u>opposed</u> an EPA proposal to curb greenhouse gas emissions and a <u>federal rule</u> to cut on-road carbon emissions. <u>Filed a suit opposing</u> a Biden order canceling the Keystone XL Pipeline. <u>Opposes investment</u> of Kentucky public pensions in banks that follow climate standards. "Will always support <u>the</u> <u>needs of Kentucky over green energy priorities</u> that will devastate our coal industry."
<b>COVID</b> Supported government action to counter the spread of COVID?	Yes. <u>Declared a state of emergency, closing all</u> <u>but "life-sustaining businesses,"</u> requiring social distancing and suspending evictions. <u>Commuted</u> <u>the sentences</u> of inmates serving sentences for "non-violent and non-sexual offenses" to "prevent the spread of COVID." <u>Restricted "mass</u> <u>gatherings,"</u> including church services. <u>Ordered</u> <u>universal masking</u> in schools. <u>"When it came to</u> <u>COVID, it was about life versus death."</u>	No. Filed <u>a challenge to Biden vaccine mandates</u> . Joined a suit against Governor Beshear's <u>order</u> <u>closing schools to limit COVID spread</u> . Urged <u>the</u> <u>end of universal masking</u> in Jefferson County schools. <u>Challenged the emergency powers</u> used by Governor Beshear to issue COVID-19 executive orders as "government overreach."
<b>CRIMINAL JUSTICE</b> How to ensure effectiveness and fairness in law enforcement?	Opposed the Kentucky grand jury decision to not charge officers in the shooting of Breonna Taylor. Signed a bill limiting the use of "no-knock" police raids to cases involving violent crime. Signed a bill ending the practice of automatically trying juveniles in adult court in gun-related crimes. Signed a major pay raise for state troopers, with funding for body cameras and increased training.	<u>"Victims – not criminals – get our priority."</u> <u>Endorsed the grand jury decision</u> to not charge officers in the shooting of Breonna Taylor. <u>Opposed waiving for indigent people the fees</u> required to expunge a criminal record. <u>Proposes</u> police bonuses, tougher penalties against drug traffickers, and a required death penalty for anyone convicted of murdering a police officer.
<b>EDUCATION</b> Use public funding for private and/or for-profit schools?	No. <u>"I believe charter schools overall are</u> <u>unconstitutional.</u> " <u>"You can't starve public</u> <u>schools</u> of the dollars that they need and then give their dollars to corporations Public dollars have to be going into public schools."	Yes. "You can make sure we have a strong public education system, <u>but we can also expand</u> <u>choice."</u> As Attorney General <u>appealed a court</u> <u>ruling</u> that struck down a school choice program approved by lawmakers. Was <u>"saddened" that</u> <u>the Kentucky Supreme Court upheld that ruling</u> .
