ABORTION Ban or legal?	Mostly ban. "I am pro-life." Would back "federal judges who understand the importance of protecting life." Will oppose "federal funding of abortion." In 2021 would protect "the lives of unborn babies" like he'd protect "any other American." In 2024 wouldn't "support a national abortion ban."	Legal. Supports "a woman's right to make her own health care decisions" and "will fight to expand women's rights." Voted to protect abortion rights for women and providers. Opposes "partisan efforts to defund" Planned Parenthood.
CLIMATE CHANGE Should climate change be a top priority?	No. Opposes Biden administration's stricter emission standards for heavy duty vehicles. "We've been plagued by politicians pushing extreme left energy agendas, like the Green New Deal, that raise prices and destroy jobs."	Yes. "The <u>climate crisis</u> has very real impacts in Nevada We must keep taking action to protect our planet." <u>Voted</u> for "the biggest investment in <u>combating</u> climate change." <u>Supports</u> "clean energy."
CRIMINAL JUSTICE How to ensure effectiveness and fairness in law enforcement?	"I <u>stand</u> with law enforcement, and I'm committed to fully funding and enhancing – not politicizing – public safety." Wants leaders who are " <u>committed</u> to pursuing justice against anyone who disregards public safety."	Supports "Nevada's law enforcement agencies." Secured funding for police agencies and victim services. Sponsored Justice in Policing Act "because we must take action to address systemic racism."
ECONOMY Decrease or increase government investment in, and regulation of, the economy?	Decrease. "Congress <u>has mortgaged</u> America's future." <u>Proposed</u> eliminating federal agencies with "a state counterpart," such as Depts of Education and Transportation. <u>Opposed</u> the 2021 infrastructure law. In 2022 <u>proposed</u> "painful" federal spending cuts.	Increase. Supports increasing federal funds for affordable housing. Voted to increase investment in semiconductor chip manufacturing in the US. Voted for the \$1.2 trillion bipartisan infrastructure law. Would "build an economy that levels the playing field for workers and small businesses."
EDUCATION Limit teaching about racism and gender identity?	Yes. "Families deserve the power to make their own choices." Critical race theory will "poison our children's minds." Focus "on educating, not indoctrinating."	No. <u>Introduced</u> a bill expanding African American history programs at schools. "One step toward <u>dismantling systemic racism</u> is through education."
ELECTIONS Did Joe Biden win the 2020 Presidential election?	Mixed. In 2020, said Democrat-led legislatures "rammed through new laws that put ballots and election security at risk Every fraudulent vote cancels out a real vote." In 2021, said "Joe Biden is our president."	Yes. "In the face of violence, democracy prevailed." The election "was fair, safe, and secure."
ENVIRONMENT Loosen or tighten environmental regulations?	Mostly loosen. <u>Criticizes</u> EPA tailpipe emission rules supporting electric vehicle production. <u>Supported</u> establishing a nuclear waste site at Yucca Mountain in 2022, calling it a "great source of revenue," but <u>changed stance</u> in 2024. Supports " <u>forest maintenance</u> ."	Tighten. "I'm <u>committed</u> to protecting our planet." Wants to <u>protect Lake Tahoe</u> "for generations to come." Called the U.S. Supreme Court's <u>decision</u> limiting federal agencies' regulatory authority " <u>outrageous</u> ."

GUN LAWS Loosen or tighten gun regulation?	Loosen. "I will always fight to protect the Second Amendment." Calls red flag laws "an attack on people's rights." Challenges the idea of "commonsense gun control;" such laws attempt "to take our Constitutionally protected rights away."	Tighten. <u>Supports</u> "commonsense gun safety measures." <u>Voted</u> to <u>enhance</u> background checks for minors and implement red flag laws. Sponsored bills banning <u>bump stocks</u> and <u>assault weapons</u> . "Gun violence is a <u>public health crisis</u> ."
HEALTHCARE Increase or decrease government support for healthcare?	Decrease. "More regulations only <u>lead</u> to less innovation." <u>Opposes</u> Obamacare and <u>capping insulin</u> at \$35 for Medicare recipients. In 2024 " <u>will not cut</u> Social Security, Medicare, or Medicaid," but in 2022 <u>voiced support</u> for Sen. Rick Scott's " <u>Rescue America</u> " plan, which included sunsetting all three programs.	Increase. Supported rural access to telehealth and expansion of mobile health clinics. Opposed efforts to repeal Obamacare. Supported capping insulin at \$35; introduced bipartisan legislation to reduce prescription drug costs for seniors. Social Security and Medicare "are lifelines for our seniors."
IMMIGRATION How to handle immigration? Support a path to citizenship for "DACA" participants brought to the US as children?	"It's time to <u>secure</u> the border." <u>Opposed</u> the bipartisan border security bill. <u>Supports</u> "more funding for border security" and "legal immigration only." " <u>Finish</u> the wall." <u>Did not answer</u> a Las Vegas Review Journal questionnaire about DACA.	"Immigration reform is vital for our economy." Supported a bipartisan border security bill to hire more agents, provide resources, and streamline the asylum process. Supports "a path to citizenship for [DACA] Dreamers."
LABOR Make it easier or harder for unions to organize?	Harder. Criticizes role of teachers unions in schools, blaming Nevada's low education ranking on "teachers' unions and bureaucrats." Opposes "propping up union interests."	Easier. "I know firsthand just how important unions are to lift up working families." Sponsored the PRO Act, protecting workers trying to organize. "We need to protect their right to bargain for higher wages."
LGBTQ RIGHTS Limit or expand LGBTQ rights?	Likely limit. Would protect women's sports from trans players. Same-sex marriage should not be overturned, but chairs the Nevada Faith & Freedom Coalition; the national group supports "traditional marriage." "Why is government in the business of marriage to begin with?"	Expand. "I will continue fighting until every member of our community is free and equal." Supported bills prohibiting discrimination against LGBTQ people and federally protecting same-sex marriage.
MARIJUANA Ban or legal?	No position found.	Legal. Supported bills <u>expunging</u> cannabis convictions, sealing records, and <u>ensuring</u> banking services to legal cannabis businesses.
MINIMUM WAGE Raise the federal minimum from \$7.25 per hour?	No position found.	Raise. In 2021, <u>sponsored</u> a bill to raise the minimum wage to \$15 by 2025. Will "keep fighting to raise the minimum wage."
STUDENT FINANCIAL AID Support lowering interest on student loans and/or forgiving them?	No. <u>Criticized</u> the "\$300B spent to forgive student loans."	Yes. Supported refinancing federal student loans at lower interest rates. Opposed a resolution to block Biden's student debt relief program.
TAXES Raise or lower taxes on corporations and wealthier individuals?	Lower. Supports making permanent a 2017 Trump tax bill with the largest one-time cut in corporate tax rate and tax breaks to the wealthy.	Raise. "Make the ultra-wealthy & billion-dollar corporations pay their fair share." Would end the 2017 tax cuts in favor of "middle-class tax relief."
VOTING RULES Make voting harder or easier?	Harder. Supports passing "election integrity legislation" and voter ID laws. "Voter ID is a highly effective way to secure our elections."	Easier . Supported restoring key provisions of the 1965 Voting Rights Act and legislation expanding voter access and registration. "We must protect the sacred right to vote."
