ABORTION Ban or legal?	Ban. Proposed a bill in the PA Senate banning abortion once "heartbeat" is detected (usually at six weeks), with no exception for rape, incest, or the life of the mother. "If the baby has a heartbeat, the abortion cannot be performed." In 2019 said women who have abortions could be prosecuted for murder.	Legal. Will "veto any bill restricting abortion rightswill expand access to reproductive care." Filed brief challenging the legality of banning abortion at 15 weeks. "I trust the women of Pennsylvania to make decisions about their own bodies."
CLIMATE CHANGE Should climate change be a top priority? Tax or limit the output of greenhouse gases, or support renewable energy?	No. Global warming is not real; it's "fake science." How can we "believe what [the weatherman] says for a hundred years from now?" Will take PA out of Regional Greenhouse Gas initiative on day one.	Yes. "We need to take real action to address climate change." Has concerns about Governor Wolf's carbon tax plan but wants to "chart a path towards a low carbon future" by investing in renewable energy and carbon capture.
EDUCATION  How to address the teaching of issues around race and gender identity?	Would place "an immediate ban on Critical Race Theory and Gender Theory studies." "On day one, CRT is over."	No position found.
<b>EDUCATION</b> Use public funding for private and/or forprofit schools?	Yes. <u>"Administrative bloat has become commonplace"</u> in PA public schools. Wants to expand scholarship programs <u>so parents can choose public or private schools.</u>	No. Voted <u>against a charter school voucher</u> <u>program in the state house in 2011</u> . As attorney general, filed a brief supporting <u>a lawsuit demanding adequate public school funding</u> .
ELECTIONS  Did Joe Biden legitimately win the 2020  Presidential election?	No. The election in PA was "compromised."  Organized and funded buses to the DC  January 6 rally and attended himself. Calls his subpoena from the US House January 6  Committee a "badge of honor."	Yes. "We had a free and fair, safe and secure election, and as attorney general, I stood up to the attempts to undermine our democracy."
ENVIRONMENT Loosen or tighten environmental regulations?	Loosen. Would <u>cut statewide regulations</u> in order to expand fracking and the coal industry.	Tighten. Criminally charged fracking companies for repeated pollution violations. Seeks "stronger laws to holdcompanies accountable."
GUN RULES Pass less or more restrictive legislation on guns?	Less. Cosponsored a bill to prevent PA officials from enforcing any new federal gun restrictions. "We saw Hitler do the same thing in Germany." Also cosponsored a bill to allow concealed gun-carry without a license or permit.	More. Supports <u>universal background</u> <u>checks</u> , <u>closing the ghost-gun loophole</u> , <u>and</u> <u>red-flag laws</u> , which allow courts to remove guns from people deemed to pose a threat.

HEALTH CARE Increase government role in health care, such as expanding Medicaid, limiting drug prices, or promoting COVID safety?	No. Would <u>ban any government mask</u> <u>mandates</u> , calling for <u>restoring supporters'</u> <u>"private personal freedom."</u> Sought the <u>suspension of federal medical privacy rules</u> <u>for individuals</u> in the face of the pandemic.	Yes. Defended the Affordable Care Act as a "vital safety net" in "the midst of a resurgent COVID-19 pandemic." In 2021 asked the PA Supreme Court to keep the state's school mask mandate in place.
IMMIGRATION How to handle immigration? Support a path to citizenship for "DACA" participants brought to the US as children?	Supports a border wall and sending PA National Guard to the Mexican border. Opposes sanctuary cities. "We're going to put these DACA lawbreakers ahead of all these good peopletrying to come here legallyThey should not become citizens. They need to go back home."	Supports DACA, for PA youth brought to the US illegally as children. "Dreamers are Americans." Supports comprehensive immigration reform.
LABOR Make it easier or harder for unions to organize?	Harder. Would make PA a right-to-work state, where employees in a unionized workplace are allowed to not pay union dues, which can lessen the union's resources.	Easier. "Pennsylvania workersdeserve a Governor who willnot only protect the right to organize, but expand it, soevery worker has the opportunity to join a union."
LGBTQ RIGHTS Limit or expand LGBTQ rights?	Limit. Gay marriage should not be legal; "I'm for traditional marriage." Gender identity should "absolutely not" be added to anti-discrimination laws. LGBTQ couples should not be allowed to adopt.	Expand. "Expand Pennsylvania's hate crime law to include crimes against our LGBTQ+ people. That's something that I sponsored when I was in the house."
MARIJUANA Should recreational marijuana be banned or legal?	Ban. Legalization causes an increase in violence, mental illness, and driving under the influence. "It's just madness and stupid."	Legal. Legalization will "bring billions of dollars to Pennsylvania." "Expunge the records of those serving time for non-violent marijuana convictions."
MINIMUM WAGE Keep or raise the state minimum from \$7.25 per hour? If raise, how much?	Keep. A minimum wage increase would be a "death knell" to small businesses.  Economic drivers should decide "the right wage for the right area."	Raise. "We neednothing less than [a] 15-dollar minimum wage." "Pennsylvania's minimum wage is \$7.25 under the federal poverty line. Every working Pennsylvanian deserves a living wage."
POLICE AND COMMUNITY How to address police use of force?	No position found on use of force. Supports increased police funding.	Supported a 2020 law that requires law enforcement agencies to consult a statewide police database with access to any misconduct and disciplinary records of officers that they're seeking to hire.
STUDENT FINANCIAL AID Support lowering interest on student loans or forgiving them?	No position found.	Likely yes. Co-led litigation in a lawsuit with 39 attorneys general that resulted in the cancellation of \$1.7 billion in student loan balances at a major student loan servicer.
TAXES Should corporations pay less or more taxes?	Less. Will attract "new employers to PA by reducing the Corporate Net Income Tax Rate."	Mixed. Will <u>lower corporate net income</u> tax, while closing tax loopholes.
VOTING RULES Support tightened restrictions on such voting rules as absentee and early voting, and voter ID?	Yes. Will eliminate no-excuse mail-in voting and ballot drop boxes, and enact universal voter ID. Will delete PA voter rolls and make all voters re-register to vote.	No. Will "expand early voting and set up automatic voter registration." Will "veto any efforts to restrict mail-in voting." Is willing to discuss voter ID "in good faith."
