The <u>effort</u> to repeal Obamacare is "a venomous snake that will bite a lot of Americans." <u>Introduced</u> a bill to lower prescription drug costs for low-income Medicare enrollees. <u>Sponsored</u> a bill capping insulin price at \$35. <u>Voted</u> for <u>government</u> to negotiate Medicare drug costs.	<b>Mostly decrease</b> . In 2022 <u>criticized</u> his Republican primary opponent Mehmet Oz for his <u>past</u> support of Obamacare. Has discussed <u>potentially</u> <u>cutting</u> "entitlements." <b>IMMIGRATION</b> How to handle immigration? Support a path to citizenship for DACA participants brought to the US as children?	<u>Voted</u> for a bipartisan bill to <u>tighten</u> the border and asylum system. <u>Supports</u> bringing undocumented immigrants "out of the shadows and into our communities and economy." <u>Would</u> hire more border patrol agents to stop the flow of fentanyl. In 2018 <u>called</u> for "permanent protections for [DACA] Dreamers."	"We <u>need</u> to use our military to take out the [drug] cartels." Use drones and "special forces" to stop the flow of fentanyl. <u>Supports</u> a return to Trump's border policies: "Finish the wall. Keep people going only through legal entry points." LGBTQ RIGHTS Limit or expand LGBTQ rights?	<b>Expand</b> . <u>Sponsored</u> a bill <u>prohibiting</u> discrimination based on sexual orientation and gender identity. <u>Voted</u> to federally recognize <u>same-sex marriage</u> . <u>Sponsored</u> a bill to <u>ban</u> commercial conversion therapy.	<b>Mixed</b> . <u>Opposes</u> transgender students participating in women's sports. But while CEO, his hedge fund promoted <u>LGBTQ hiring</u> to "grow the best talent across <u>gender identity</u> " and "sexual orientation," with "fully paid coverage for <u>gender transitions</u> ."

MINIMUM WAGE Raise the federal minimum from \$7.25 per hour?	<b>Yes</b> . "\$7.25/hour is <u>not enough</u> for working people to live on." <u>Voted</u> to raise. In 2019 <u>supported</u> gra- dually raising the minimum wage to \$15 an hour.	<b>No.</b> "I wouldn't change the minimum wage we have now I <u>wouldn't raise it</u> ."
<b>SOCIAL SECURITY</b> Cut Social Security and raise the retirement age?	<b>No</b> . "Social Security is the most successful <u>antipoverty program</u> to date." STUDENT FINANCIAL AID Support lowering interest on student loans and/or forgiving them?	Yes. <u>Supported</u> canceling \$10,000 of student debt for those making less than \$125,000 a year. <u>Opposed</u> an effort to overturn Biden's student debt relief plan. In 2019 <u>sponsored</u> a bill allowing eligible student loan borrowers to <u>refinance at lower</u> rates.	
<b>TAXES</b> Raise or lower taxes on corporations and wealthier individuals?	<b>Raise</b> . <u>Supports</u> reversing 2017 "massive tax cuts for the ultra-wealthy and big corporations." <u>Would</u> <u>make</u> largest oil companies pay higher taxes on excess profits, <u>make</u> "wealthy tax cheats and the biggest corporations pay their fair share of taxes."	<b>Mostly lower</b> . <u>Opposes</u> "tax increases." <u>Inflation</u> is "not greedflation [by] you in this room, business people, it's not because you're greedy." <u>Said</u> "we need to make permanent the [2017] <u>Tax Cuts and</u> <u>Jobs Act</u> ," the biggest <u>corporate cuts</u> in US history.
VOTING RULES Make voting harder or easier?	<b>Easier.</b> <u>Introduced</u> bills to improve voting access for those with disabilities. Sponsored <u>two bills</u> to expand voter registration and voting access.	Harder. <u>Would require</u> "a photo ID to vote" and ballots "in by Election Day." <u>Disagrees with</u> Act 77 no-excuse mail-in voting, but "it's something" Republicans have "got to embrace."
