ADULT HONOREE

Fatima Goss Graves is the President and CEO of the National Women's Law Center (NWLC), where she has worked for over a decade advancing gender and racial justice. She also serves as President of the NWLC Action Fund and is a co-founder of the TIME'S UP Legal Defense Fund, which connects individuals facing workplace sexual misconduct with legal and public relations support.

Goss Graves is a nationally recognized expert in law and public policy, especially in the areas of workplace fairness, income security, reproductive rights, and education access. Her work places particular emphasis on improving outcomes for women and girls of color. Before becoming CEO in 2017, she held senior leadership roles at NWLC, including Vice President for Education and Employment and Senior Vice President for Program.

She frequently testifies before Congress, contributes to major media outlets like The New York Times and NPR, and is a sought-after speaker on gender equity and civil rights. Her legal expertise and public leadership have earned her recognition across sectors, including the 2020 John W. Gardner Leadership Award from the Independent Sector.

A graduate of UCLA and Yale Law School, Goss Graves began her legal career clerking for Judge Diane P. Wood on the U.S. Court of Appeals for the Seventh Circuit and later practiced at Mayer Brown LLP. She currently advises on national initiatives related to campus sexual misconduct and workplace harassment. Goss Graves lives in Washington, D.C., with her family and continues to be a powerful voice for justice and equality.
